
Some of the specific requirements must include Disability Standards and the ability to build Tiny Homes that can be 'demounted' and reused for Disaster Relief.

Apart from creating Award Winning Housing, these teams would be creating a blueprint for communities that have been devastated by Natural Disasters by creating standards for Emergency, Temporary and Refugee housing, beyond the 'Tent Cities' that occur so often.

Innovative solutions can be created that provide realistic shelter in various categories:
For example: Single Accommodation, Twin Accommodation, Double plus Twin Accommodation etc...

At the conclusion of the Games, all accommodation is made available to Relief Organizations for rapid removal and redeployment.

A variety of Tax Incentives could assist corporate donors to supply materials and guidance to create Community Champions..





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Not everyone is suited to sports activities, but perhaps they have as much to contribute in other ways. Many industries assist their employees to achieve greatness in their fields through mentoring, apprenticeships and post graduate research. There is every reason for these people to be able to compete on the world stage to show that they are leaders in their field.

There are many other International Awards that could be incorporated into the Olympics - with individual National Championships held as a lead up to the Official Games.

Strength, Agility and Endurance are not the only defining characteristics of the peak of humanity. The Annual Nobel Prize is a perfect example. Many Industries have their own separate award system, but I propose that the Olympics can do more than just add a new sport every four years - I believe that they may prove to be the Governing Standard for a much wider range of activities.

The Summer Games, The Paralympics, The Winter Games, The Medical Awards, The Science Awards, The Literature Awards, the Mechanical Awards, The Space Awards and the list goes on....

The spirit of Inclusiveness goes far beyond the realm of Sport.

If this is beyond the Charter of the Olympic Community, perhaps there has to be a completely different governing body.
